Boat Registration Rules and Regulations Form

Below is a breakdown, by category, of the Candlewick Lake Boating Rules and Regulations. These regulations are provided for your knowledge and awareness. You are responsible for abiding by these regulations, as well as all State and local boating laws.

1. Boats and Watercraft General Provisions:

- A. The provisions of the State of Illinois Boat and Safety act are incorporated by reference into these regulations.
- B. Every boat operator is required to know the boat registration and safety act.
- C. Any boat and all watercraft required to be registered by the state of Illinois and operated on Candlewick Lake must be registered in Illinois or with the State of primary use. All such boats or watercraft must clearly display the state Registration.
- D. All boats and any other watercraft used to transport a passenger on Candlewick Lake must be registered with Candlewick Lake.
- E. Any boat operator involved in a boating accident must report such accident immediately to the Security Department and/or General Manager.
- F. No boat shall be operated in any restricted areas which are marked by buoys or may be designated from time to time.
- G. Boats must stay at least 100 feet from a flag or buoy marking the presence of a scuba diver.
- H. Person(s) wishing to "TEST" watercraft that is not in accordance with CWL rules, must speak with the General Manager on a case by case basis for approval.

2. Restrictions on sizes and types of boats:

- A. No boat operated on Candlewick Lake may exceed 20 feet in length.
- B. There is a 70 Horsepower limit on all watercraft on Candlewick Lake. Exception: those boats with c.a.r.b. 2-3 rating or 4-stroke engines may have up to a 75HP motor.
- C. Houseboats may NOT be operated on Candlewick Lake, nor may anyone sleep overnight on any boat.
- D. The following (But not limited to these) items are excluded from being on the lake or on the development unless special permission of the General Manager: Hovercraft, airplanes landing or taking off, hot air balloons, ultra light aircraft, ice sailboats.
- E. Miscellaneous watercraft such as: Rafts, tubes, and other inflated play craft are not allowed out beyond the "No Wake" buoys. Exception: Those craft being pulled behind a boat as a skiing device.

3. Operation Rules and Regulations:

- A. Those persons falling under the special family member designation may be in a boat on Candlewick Lake without the property owner being present.
- B. You must be with your guest at all times while operating a GUEST BOAT or WATERCRAFT on Candlewick Lake. Guests operating YOUR BOAT on Candlewick Lake may do so with your permission and only if you are in the development.
- C. Traffic Flow for speed boats and water skiing boats must be on a counterclockwise direction around the lake.
- D. Boats must never exceed a speed which is safe and reasonable for the prevailing conditions and never above 30 MPH.
- E. The racing of power boats is NOT permitted.
- F. No boat may exceed a slow "No Wake" speed while inside the marker buoys or other designated restricted areas. A "No Wake" speed of 5 MPH will be observed.
- G. Power boating is permitted between the hours of 10:00 AM and 7:30 PM each day. After September 15, the evening hour is changed to sunset as a safety measure.
- H. All boats exceeding a "No Wake" speed must remain 200 feet outwardly of the shoreline and 50 feet outwardly of the marker buoys and other markers designating restricted areas.

4. Personal Watercraft:

- A. Personal watercraft are registered under the boating provisions and are governed by the same regulations.
- B. Personal watercraft must travel in a counterclockwise direction around the lake and remain 200 feet outwardly of the shoreline and 50 feet outwardly of the buoys and other markers.
- C. Personal watercraft may not exceed 30 MPH and must follow power boat regulations regarding No Wake.
- D. The rule of common courtesy (noise level) and "fair play" should be followed when on the lake and other water activities are going on, fishing, skiing, boating, swimming, etc.
- E. U.S. Coast Guard approved personal flotation devices must be worn while personal watercraft is being operated
- F. The lanyard cord, if equipped, must be attached to the operator at all times while underway.

5. Water Skiing:

- A. The provisions of the State of Illinois Boat Registration and Safety act have been adopted by the Board of Directors to be applicable to all water skiing activities on Candlewick Lake. Any violation of the State Law is a violation of CWL Regulations
- B. Water-skiing may take place between 10:00 AM and 7:30 PM each day. After September 15 the evening hour is changed to Sunset as a safety measure.
- C. All skiers must remain 200 feet outwardly of the shoreline and 50 feet outwardly of the buoys and other markers.
- D. Kites, jumps and slalom courses may not be used in connection with skiing activities unless express written permission is first obtained from the General Manager.
- E. The intentional dropping of one or more skis is not permitted except within 50 feet outwardly of the buoys along the shore away from the beaches and where inshore winds prevail at that time.
- F. Neither a boat towing a skier nor the skier being towed may not enter a "No Wake" restricted area which is marked by buoys or which may otherwise be designated from time-to-time.

NOTE: Operators of Oversized motors may lower their motor into the water for steering purposes ONLY, the motor MUST NOT be running.
